Phase II Updates

Begins on October 19, 2020

Preparing For and Addressing Illness

- **NEW** - LCCS is required to report to the Stark County Health Department the names of students who have been exposed to enable the department to do tracing. Students who are sent home with a fever must do the following:
 - Parents should keep their students home until fever-free without the use of fever-reducing medication. Parents must call the school nurse prior to returning to school to report they are NOT experiencing any other symptoms of COVID-19.
 - If other symptoms are present, the student must be seen by a physician and a return to school note must be given to the school with a diagnosis, permission to return to school, and a physician's signature.

Classrooms

- **NEW** - Students will be able to move between classrooms for classes that are taught by other teachers in the same grade. All surfaces must be wiped down after each group finishes.
- **NEW** - Music will take place in the music room. Spanish and Art classes for elementary will also be conducted in the Elementary classrooms. Physical education will continue in the gymnasium or outside.
- **NEW** - Students will be allowed to visit the library while wearing masks - books will be placed to assure students are not congregating in a specific area, no access to the "stacks" by students will be allowed, and all surfaces will be wiped down between classes.

Social Events

- **NEW** - Parent-teacher conferences will be held with required masks and social distancing OR parents could schedule a virtual meeting with the teacher.

Student Afterschool Clubs and Activities

- **NEW** - After-school clubs can meet with proper health precautions of masks, distancing, and cleaning of surfaces. The number of participants may be limited. Principal approval is needed. Details about signing up for elementary clubs will be communicated through the Parent Memo at a later date. Secondary clubs will begin meeting following the same guidelines.
- **NEW** - Field trips will be considered and approved based on the ability to social distance at the venue and on the bus. Multi-class field trips will be considered based on the ability to keep the classes separate if indoors and socially

distanced. Outdoor field trips may be permitted based on the ability to keep students from congregating together.

Lunch

- **NEW** - Students in grades 4-6 will begin to walk to the lunch room to pick up their pre-packaged lunches. Classes will be scheduled to avoid congregating in the hallways. Students will be required to maintain social distancing, and they will return to their classrooms to eat their lunch.

Most of these changes will begin at the start of the second quarter, October 19th.
