





# BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL OPTIONS

Lake Center provides various child care services to serve your family's needs. All payments are made through your school account.

#### Before School Care Grades K-12

Your child(ren) can be dropped off between 7:00-7:30 am in the Cafenasium, before regular drop-off, for Before School Care. Students should sign in with LCCS staff. supervisior. Advance registration is not required

COST - \$2.50 Per Day

#### After School Care Grades K-6

Lake Center's After School Care Program operates from 2:45pm - 6:30pm each school day. This program is supervised by LCCS staff. Students can play games, make art and crafts and are given snacks. They can also receive homework assistance. As weather permits, outside play is scheduled on the playground.

Students that are not picked up by 3:05pm will automatically be sent to the After School Care Program for supervision.

COST - \$10.00 Per Day

### After School Study Table Grades 7-12

Your secondary student can be enrolled in our After School Study Table Program beginning at 3:00pm each school day. Study Table is located in various classrooms and will be supervised by LCCS staff. The fee is waived for students waiting for an after school event to begin.

COST - \$5.00 Per Hour

# TRAFFIC SAFETY



# Traffic Rules



Administrators and staff supervise arrival and dismissal to help your child(ren) at Door #10. Please obey their directions to ensure everyone's safety by following these traffic rules and communicating them with others who are helping you.

- Only use cell phone to announce on PikMykid
- 10 MILE SPEED LIMIT on campus.
- Follow traffic flow arrows & direction signs.
- Pull up as far as possible in the car line and stop at designated areas marked by cones for drop off and pick up.
- Have your child(ren) ready to exit and enter vehicles within 20-30 seconds.
- Drivers are not permitted to exit a vehicle to help child(ren).
   Administrators will help them.
- All students are to get in and out of vehicles on the passenger side only to use the sidewalk.
- If you need to move out of line, please use your turn signal to communicate to the Traffic Director and wait for assistance.
- If you must transport items in your trunk, you must park and use Door #1 to walk your children into the building.
- When parking, use designated, outlined spots only. Do not back into a parking spot.
- Please communicate LCCS Traffic Rules and PikMyKid procedures with others that are helping you drop off or pick up your child(ren).

Drop Off - Door #10

# **2023-2024 THEME PASSAGE:** EPHESIANS 6:10-20

Our theme this year, Stand in the full Armor of God is based on the familiar passage from Ephesians 6:10-20. In the passage the Apostle Paul says:

"Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand." Eph 6:13 "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms." Eph 6:12

Paul exhorts the Church like a commanding officer preparing his army for battle. The battle is real and in the battle you need to stand firm, put on the full armor of God. The imagery of a Roman soldier's armor would not be lost on the people of Paul's day. Belt, breastplate, shoes, helmet, and the weapons of sword and shield were all a familiar if not an intimidating sight in that day. Rome's legions kept the peace in its broad empire with an ever present "big stick."

I think it's interesting for us to note that all of the Roman soldier's armor and weapons were designed for a frontal attack. The Legions' battle plan was for unified, disciplined side by side defense and advancement; face forward, shoulder to shoulder, shield to shield, stand firm. No provision was made for retreat because the unity of the legion would negate any reason for such a retreat. Individual soldiers standing alone were vulnerable, backs and sides unprotected. Individually they were weak, but together the legions were nearly invincible.

There's no foe can that can defeat us when we're walking side by side

Put on the full armor. I think we miss this point in the illustration. When we read this passage we see an English knight clad in impenetrable armor; a bold warrior standing alone. Paul and the early church envisioned something very different. Yes we have armor and the weapons of our warfare are mighty to the pulling down of strongholds, but we need to stand together. Individually we are not nearly as strong as we are when we are united. Two or more are mighty.

I've heard it said that there is no "I" in team. There's no "I" in Church either. We need to be the Church of our Christ; loving each other, serving one another. Jesus said, "By this all men will know you are my disciples." The Battle is real, and we need to stand; side by side. There is no foe that can defeat us.






# Student Information System Update

We are excited to announce that we have been busy upgrading the software platforms we use for student information management and billing. These new platforms, PowerSchool and EduTrak, are leaders in the education industry and have been around for more than 25 years. More detailed information for how to access information (schedules, report cards, attendance, behavior, billing, etc) will come in a separate communication in EARLY AUGUST!



### Junior & Senior High Chromebook Loan

We will once again be loaning LCCS-owned devices to students in grades 7-12 who would like to borrow and use one for the school year. The necessary loan form, which must be signed to borrow a device, will be available on-site at the time the device is picked up.



If you would prefer for your child to use his/her own device while on campus at LCCS, they will simply bring their device on the first day of school. They will need their LCCS-issued username/password to connect to the network. If you are looking for a device for your son/daughter, Best Buy has some inexpensive Chromebooks available that would work wonderfully for school purposes as part of their back-to-school sale.

Assistance for obtaining user information and/or password resets for returning students will be done upon the return to school. New students will receive their account information in their homerooms on the first day of school.

# **Buying lunch**

Lake Center students may pay by cash or check for their meals. Meals may be paid for the day students are eating their lunch or students may pre-pay for their lunches. LCCS will permit students to charge up to three lunches. When a student reaches the three lunch limit, he or she will be offered an alternative lunch at a reduced cost. This lunch will consist of a PB&J uncrustable, fruit, and milk.

Shortly after the creation of the high school in the 2003-04 school year, the 2004-05 school year served as the first official year of varsity competition.
